President's Comments:**

Trustee La Russa thanked the many who attended the most recent Neighborhood Watch Meeting and commented on various issues discussed. A combination of restructuring of the grid along with the consistency of communication between block captains and their neighbors enables the Neighborhood Watch Program to move forward in a more positive direction.

Community / Family Relations:

Chief Yingling and his staff responded to resident's comments regarding those who avoid stopping at the stop signs in our Village, by issuing 57 traffic violations within one month. In addition, shared details of department plans for future deceptive operations intended to assist with catching those committing such crimes while they continue to be vigilant with community policing.

Police Report:

It is announced that, honors were presented recently to Officer Sutton, Officer Gonzalez, Chief Yingling and President Petrosky for their efforts to enhance relations with students and staff of the Southern View Elementary School.

Trustee Bourland had nothing to report.

Trustee Patsche had nothing to report except for the communication from U-HAUL CORP. confirming their plans to move forward with a development in our Village; as-well-as, a conversation with John Kilroy, regarding his intent to

refresh a gaming room at the Rt 66 Village Mall.

Residential Bldg. Permits: Trustee Van Fossan reported on several residences that were issued citations for violations. And due to the cooperation and assistance from the S.V.P.D. most of those issues were resolved in a more expeditious manner.

Commercial Bldg. Permits: Compliments also to the S.V.P.D. for the creation of a more detailed form which clearly identifies ordinance violations, enhancing not only professionalism but the seriousness of a notice to comply. It is evident that more and more residents are taking better care of their property as a result of being consistent with such attention to details.

Health & Safety: Trustee McLaughlin complimented the Public Works crew on the repair of the park bridge and encourages everyone to take time to walk the park to view it.

After finding the recent damage at the West Pavilion it was learned that a security camera did not identify the source, yet think it was more of an accident than anything intentional.

Trustee James L Foster commented on repairs needed for the backhoe; and, discussed the tons of debris being picked up from the garage sales as-well-as, any other alternatives for this service that may be utilized.
